The Ten Commandments

The following is an excerpt from Father Steve's sermon on Lent 3 about the Ten Commandments. This is being printed by request. The sermon (and all sermons) can be found in its entirety on our website.

Hear the ten commandments in a new way; in a way I believe they were intended.

"I am the Lord, your God. Only me. Because I love you, I've given your freedom.

The world, looking for meaning and substance has created a lot of other Gods.

Don't worry about them. They're not real. They're just things. So don't worship them.

You look silly doing that. And besides, it hurts my feelings. You don't need things to make me real. I'm not a place. I'm present for you because I love you and I'm loyal to those who keep my commandments.

Try to make that enough.

And if you would, show me some respect. Maybe that's how I know you're grateful.

Don't take my name lightly and don't use my name when it's really not me doing the talking.

And give yourself a break.

Most of you work hard and need a little Sabbath.

Set aside some time to remind yourself what it is you're working so hard for;

your children, your family, your friends.

And while you're at it, set aside some time for me.

Let's spend the day together. It helps put things in perspective. I promise.

Take care of your mom and dad, just like they took care of you.

It's part of the circle of life.

Maybe they weren't perfect, but you aren't either.

Honor them. It's just the right thing to do.

And if you can't remember anything else, remember this. Don't steal.

It's a biggie.

When you kill a man, you steal a life.

You steal his wife's right to a husband and rob his children of a father.

When you tell a lie, you steal someone's right to the truth. When you cheat, you steal the right to fairness.

Don't do it!

Be loyal, not just to me but to all you make a covenant with.

You humans are some of my very best ideas, so I bless you. Maybe you don't have everything you want.

Maybe the guy down the street has it made; has all the toys you think important.

But that was never part of the deal.

Don't waste a minute focusing on what you don't have.

Be thankful for what you do have.

You'll be happier.

I bless you with my presence; not matter what, no matter how hard.

That's my promise and the truth is I don't ask for much in return."

Adult Christian Education: Father Tom

Having been back with you for three years now, I can say that It would be impossible to serve a parish more enjoyable and spiritually rewarding than Holy Nativity. The only thing I miss is the daily interaction with the students at Holy Nativity School, but I have served the school as Financial Aid Administrator for the past decade or more, a ministry of helping others that takes an enormous amount of time, especially this season of the year. General Convention of The Episcopal Church has authorized several new Rite Two type liturgies and published them in a red book called Enriching Our Worship. I have used them at other parishes I have served, and found that people really took to them. With Father Steve's OK, we are going to worship with some of it this summer at the ten-thirty service (eight o'clock worship will continue unchanged with Rite One). It's all good, and refreshing, and I believe folks will thoroughly enjoy it. Let's call it "Summer Worship." Look ahead, and when you are in town, be sure to join us!

Meantime, by the time you read this we will have finished our Inquirers' Seminar and Confirmation Classes, both Sunday morning and Tuesday morning.







Replication of North Entrance at South and West entrances.



Often we have to adjust to the play between tradition and transition. At Holy Nativity we will continue with our traditions of Palm Sunday Children's Choir and procession, and we will not relinquish the Easter morning brunch and egg hunt, but we will need to change the sites this year. With the old cafeteria building gone and Battin Hall and the courtyard being renovated, we will sing and begin the Palm Sunday procession in front of the church. Please bring your bags of candy for the plastic eggs to the church office by April 4th or to church on Palm Sunday. The EYC "big kids" will fill the eggs on Wednesday and will hide them for us on Sunday morning.

On Easter Sunday, we will hunt eggs in the big back yard of the parish house following the brunch. Before the 10:30 service, the children will move to Kids' Kingdom to prepare to process into church for Flowering the Cross. Most of the children have picked up their mite boxes by now to collect their coins for Lenten giving. By attaching flowers to the boxes, we can present our offerings as we flower the cross. Please remind your children to bring their mite boxes and flowers that morning, however, we will have extra mite boxes and flowers ready for visitors and those who forget.

Thank you for your contributions to the Backpack Ministry. The children have had the opportunity to become active participants on Wednesday evenings by stuffing backpacks, fifty-three of them, in assembly line style. Working together, they are having fun while serving others in a way that they can fully understand. It is a joy to see that they care. We are blessed with wonderful children. Thank you so much.
