April 13 Palm Sunday

(The service begins in the Courtyard.) 8:00 am Holy Eucharist Rite One 9:15 am Christian Education for all ages 10:30 am Holy Eucharist Rite Two

April 14-16 Morning Prayer at 7:30 am

April 16 Stations of the Cross at 6:00 pm

A devotion consisting of prayers and meditations observing the final hours and events of the Passion of Jesus.

April 17 Maundy Thursday Service at 6:00 pm

This service of Holy Eucharist will commemorate the last supper that Jesus shared with His disciples. The service ends with the stripping of the altar.

April 18 Good Friday Service at 12 noon

This is a solemn service to recall Christ's crucifixion. Communion will be offered from reserved sacrament.


Leviticus Potluck: Wednesday, April 9th at 6 pm... Along with the Soup!

In this season of Lent, when we re-examine our relationship with God, it makes sense to think about just why it is that we think it is okay to follow some of his rules and not others. This is one of the great things about being Episcopalian - we get to think about why we do what we do. Come and play along!




April 2014

Should Wednesday Evenings in Lent be this much fun? We get to help with the short evening Eucharist service, have delicious soups for supper, and then have our program. Sometimes we watch a Bible story video and then play Bible charades. Sometimes we meet with Miss Judy (Dickey) and the youth group. We have already built wooden bird feeders. Next Wednesday we are planning a "Weed and Seed", and we are looking forward to the Leviticus Potluck on April 9th. On Wednesday of Holy Week, we will observe the traditional Stations of the Cross.

Although I almost feel guilty about enjoying the penitential season so much, we are aware (and we are encouraging the children to be aware) of the often dire needs of others. This year the offerings from our Lenten mite boxes will be donated to the International Heifer Project to buy baby chicks, not for pets, as the children first imagined, but as lifesustainers in a poverty-stricken area. We are discussing with the children ways to use their own efforts to earn the money for their mite boxes so that they will be more invested in their contributions. Please offer commercial suggestions and financial opportunities for them to do additional chores and extra work so they can experience the blessings of generosity and caring for others. If your child does not have a mite box, you may create one from any small box or bowl or sandwich bag...just something to bring in donations for Easter Sunday.

Before Easter Sunday, please bring candy-filled plastic eggs or bags of wrapped candy (no gum please) for filling the plastic eggs to church any Sunday through the 13th, or drop them by the church office through April 16th. On Palm Sunday, the children should come to Kids' Kingdom to get their palm branches and prepare for the processional from the courtyard into church.

On Easter Sunday, we will enjoy the Easter Breakfast at 9:15 followed by the egg hunt at 10:00. I will be asking many of you to help on Easter morning by bringing flowers and with the hunt, the processional, presentation of mite boxes, and Flowering the Cross.

Please remind your children to bring their Easter Baskets, mite boxes, and flowers, and we will take many pretty pictures. The older I get the more I understand the importance of making our faith celebrations memorable and meaningful for our children, and I am glad you want that for your children. If you have questions, comments, or suggestions, I welcome your calls.

Backpack Buddies Needs Your Help!

Over the last six months, the Backpack Buddies Program has provided food for 95 families, every week. You all have been incredibly generous in making this happen, but we need your help to make it down the stretch. At our current expenditure rate, we won't quite have enough money or food to reach the end of the school year. You can help not only with your monetary contributions, but also by continuing to fill a bag when you are at the grocery store for a child who benefits from this ministry. Remember, each child receives two dinners (canned stew or ravioli), two lunches (soup, Vienna sausage, etc.), two breakfasts (granola bar or instant oatmeal), four snacks, three pieces of fruit and three juice boxes. In other words, each week we send 190 breakfasts, lunch and dinners, 380 snacks, and 285 pieces of fruit and juice boxes. That is a lot of food.
