Adult Christian Education Fr. Tom

This is an exciting time for our adult Sunday School class. We go into Advent 2012 looking at Luke as our gospel for Lectionary Year C, with a bit of apocalyptic, a bit about John the Baptist, and ultimately Luke's nativity story about the Holy Family traveling to Bethlehem. As promised early in the fall season, we will spend one Advent Sunday session discussing General Convention A049, "Authorize Liturgical Resources for Blessing Same-Gender Relationships."

Adult Sunday School in January will read and discuss the Gospel according to Luke, coming at it from a historical-critical perspective as we have done Mark and John in the past.

For the mid-week Bible Seminars, Tuesday mornings and Wednesday afternoons, our final three sessions will be looking at the Gospel according to Luke, concluding December 11th and 12th. We will then take a sabbatical of sorts through the Christmas and Epiphany Seasons --

-- resuming for Spring 2013 for the Seasons of Lent and Easter, convening date TBA. Members of the seminar decide what we study and discuss, but have already generally agreed that our Easter study will be the book of Revelation.

The Chancel and Rite One Choirs

Rehearsal evenings in December will continue to be quite busy for the Chancel Choir as we practice throughout the month and right up until Christmas Eve. The entire month of December will be filled with special musical offerings and we are working hard to prepare music for Advent, when we 'prepare' for the birth of Jesus. In addition to our rehearsals for the four Sundays of Advent, there will be our annual service of Lessons and Carols on December 5th. This will be the first time that the Chancel and Rite One Choirs unite to sing together. On Christmas Eve we will offer a half an hour of seasonal music prior to each service as part of the prelude music. That means the music starts at 4:00 and 10:00 PM! After the first of the year we will be able to catch our breath only a little before we start learning new anthems for 2013 in time for the Annual Diocesan Convention and Lent!

The Rite One Choir will sing during Advent on Dec. 2^{nd} and then we will take a brief break until after Christmas. Look for rehearsals to resume on January 10^{th} . We hope our early morning choir has added to your worship experience and perhaps inspired more people to join us. You are always welcome. Weekly rehearsals are Thursday evenings from 5:30 - 6:30 PM in the church. Come and join us! We are very grateful for all of our dedicated choirs who give so much of themselves throughout the year to provide the music for our worship services week after week. God bless them! We always welcome new voices and would love to have you join us too.

Festival of Lessons and Carols – Wednesday, Dec. 5th

The Chancel and Rite One Choirs will present our annual Festival of Lessons and Carols on Wednesday evening, Dec. 5th starting at 6:30 pm. This year we will be blessed with several soloists and instrumentalists who will be sharing their musical gifts with us. For the second time we will have a String Quartet. This year they will also be joined by flute, along with our organ and piano. The glorious music of these fine musicians will resonate within our sacred space and hearts as they play on their own and accompany many of the anthems and carols.

Many years ago, this beautiful service originated based upon the medieval vigil service. A Dean of King's College Chapel, in Cambridge, England, later modified it. This service is traditionally sung there on Christmas Eve. Later, still, an Advent service of Lessons and Carols was begun. While we will still officially be in Advent as we present our Lessons and

Carols, we have elected to follow the King's College format. The service will consist of a procession, service of light, bidding prayer with the Lord's Prayer, Invitatory, nine lessons with appropriate carols and hymns sung by the Chancel and Rite Choirs and/or congregation, closing prayer, benediction and a hymn. There will also be anthems sung by the Chancel and Rite One Choirs. This seasonal presentation provides a wonderful opportunity for you to invite your friends to visit us at Holy Nativity and share in this evening. We sincerely hope that you will appreciate this special musical offering from our choirs.

The Annual Christmas Holiday Dinner will begin in Battin Hall starting at 5 :30 PM. Please call the church office to make your reservations. There is always plenty of food but we would hate to run out ! Everyone is encouraged to bring a side dish to share.

Children's Choir

The Children's Choir continues to grow – musically and spiritually. Their enthusiasm and energy abound and the excitement is contagious and praying with these children each week warms my heart. Each year offers new challenges – a few years ago, several children were missing front teeth, affecting diction. Now, in addition to missing teeth, we have several children with shiny and colored braces. All of these represent little opportunities to work together to make sure our diction is clean and clear, thereby telling the story that we sing so that you can understand. Hard work is very evident at each rehearsal.

Once again, the Children's Choir will sing on December 9th at the 2nd service for 'Pajama Sunday,' when they wear their PJ's and slippers and robes to church and bring a set of new pajamas to donate to needy children. All of the Children of Holy Nativity will be leading the congregation in our sung version of The Lord's Prayer that morning.

They are also busily rehearsing their musical selections for the early service on Christmas Eve. They will play an active role in leading all of the children in the Christmas Pageant in songs and are quite excited about the music they will be singing this year. We hope that it will make the service more meaningful for you. Following our musical offerings on Christmas Eve, we will take a break from rehearsals while school is out and return to practice on January 9th. If your child (grades 1-6) is interested, please have them join us weekly on Wednesday afternoons in the Choir office from 4:00 – 5:00. We guarantee some hard work and lots of fun!
