## Father Tom: Adult Christian Education

Whoa, are we through 2013 already? Can hardly believe it.

Saying "can hardly believe" reminds me that in our adult Sunday school class we just wrapped up a study of the creeds of the Christian Church: the Apostles' Creed that we know as our Baptismal Covenant; the Creed of Saint Athanasius, or Athanasian Creed, or *Quinque vult*; and the Nicene Creed that we stand and say most every Sunday. Sorry if you missed it.

I haven't asked the Sunday school class what they'd like to do next, which is important to do because otherwise we'll be doing historical criticism of the apocryphal Gospel of Peter and Secret Mark and the Q Gospel: the first Sunday there would be a lot of snoring, and the second Sunday it would be only Father Bubba, but I would be fascinated. Come and help decide what to read and talk about next. Note that it's "read and talk about" not "study" because it's always lots of fun, never hard work. Sometimes there's disagreement but so far nothing physical.

That's for Adult Sunday School, every Sunday between worship services, 9:15 to 10:15 in Mary Stuart Poole Library, the door at the end of the new sidewalk. Get your coffee and a cookie and come. If you come late, no problem, half of the class does.

Wednesday noon. We are having reasonable acceptance of our noon event, usually about a dozen to sixteen people. For those who want to come early, there's Healing at 11:15. At 11:30 noon Eucharist begins, about fifteen minutes all within the rubrics and canons. After the Communion service we come into Battin Hall for a light lunch (free, always tasty) and an informal Bible study, usually finishing at 12:45, which makes our Bible discussion an hour. Generally we study one of the lessons for the upcoming Sunday. All are invited and welcome, you don't have to be a member or baptized or anything, just come and enjoy.

Confirmation classes. Our bishop is coming in February, if you are interested in my inquirers' seminar, it's for both oldtimers and new folks, about our Anglican/Episcopal flavor of Christianity, our history, our theology, our worship. Speak to Madge so she has your name on the list and we'll work out when and where the classes will be: TBA.

#### The Chancel and Rite One Choirs

Rehearsal evenings in December will continue to be quite busy for the Chancel Choir as we practice throughout the month and right up until Christmas Eve. The entire month of December will be filled with special musical offerings and we are working hard to prepare music for Advent, when we 'prepare' for the birth of Jesus. In addition to our rehearsals for the four Sundays of Advent, there will be our annual service of Lessons and Carols on December 4th. Both the Chancel and Rite One Choirs will sing together for that service, as they did last year. On Christmas Eve, The Chancel Choir will offer a half an hour of seasonal music prior to each service as part of the prelude music. That means the music starts at 4:00 and 10:00 PM!

The Rite One Choir will sing during Advent on Dec.  $8^{th}$  and then we will take a brief break until after Christmas. Look for rehearsals to resume on January  $9^{th}$ . We hope our early morning choir has added to your worship experience and perhaps inspired more people to join us. You are always welcome. Weekly rehearsals are Thursday evenings from 5:30-6:30 PM in the church. Come and join us!

Singing in the choir isn't all work – we have fun, laughter and prayer time at every rehearsal. We also party and intend to do so at a Christmas Potluck Supper on Dec. 8<sup>th</sup> at the home of John and Mary Darrah. Thank you John and Mary!!

We are very grateful for all of our dedicated choirs who give so much of themselves throughout the year to provide the music for our worship services week after week. God bless them! We always welcome new voices and would love to have you join us too.

## Festival of Lessons and Carols – Wednesday, Dec. 4th

The Chancel, Children's, and Rite One Choirs will present our annual Festival of Lessons and Carols on Wednesday evening, Dec. 4th starting at 6:30 pm. This year we will be blessed with several soloists and instrumentalists who will be sharing their musical gifts with us. In addition to our organ and piano, we once again will have a String Quartet. The glorious music of these fine musicians will resonate within our sacred space and hearts as they play on their own and accompany many of the anthems and carols.

Many years ago, this beautiful service originated based upon the medieval vigil service. A Dean of King's College Chapel, in Cambridge, England, later modified it. This service is traditionally sung there on Christmas Eve. Later, still, an Advent Service of Lessons and Carols was begun. While we will still officially be in Advent as we present our Lessons and Carols, we have elected to follow the King's College format. The service will consist of a procession, service of light, bidding prayer with the Lord's Prayer, Invitatory, nine lessons with appropriate carols and hymns sung by the Chancel, Children's, and Rite Choirs and/or congregation, closing prayer, benediction and a hymn. There will also be anthems sung by the Chancel, Children's and Rite One Choirs. This seasonal presentation provides a wonderful opportunity for you to invite your friends to visit us at Holy Nativity and share in this evening. We sincerely hope that you will appreciate this special musical offering from our choirs.

The Annual Christmas Holiday Dinner will begin in Battin Hall starting at 5:30 PM. The service will begin promptly at 6:30 in the Church. Dessert and coffee will be offered immediately following the service, once again in Battin Hall. Please call the church office to make your dinner reservations. There is always plenty of food but we would hate to run out! Everyone is encouraged to bring a side dish to share.

#### Children's Choir

The Children's Choir continues to grow – musically, spiritually and in numbers. Their enthusiasm and energy abound and their excitement is contagious at this time of year. I am constantly explaining to them how important our diction is because we want you to be able to understand the story we are singing. Hard work is very evident at each rehearsal.

This year will be the first time that the Children's Choir will sing during the Service of Lessons and Carols. This requires lots of extra rehearsal and focus, but more importantly than that – this will introduce this annual service to these children and I'm sure it will make a lasting impression on them. It's those kinds of lasting impressions that assure Holy Nativity of having future choirs because we are training them now!

They are also busily rehearsing their musical selections for the early service on Christmas Eve. They will play an active role in leading all of the children in the Christmas Pageant in songs and are quite excited about the music they will be singing this year. We hope that it will make the service more meaningful for you. Following our musical offerings on Christmas Eve, we will take a break from rehearsals while school is out and return to practice on January  $8^{th}$ . If your child (grades 1-6) is interested, please have them join us weekly on Wednesday afternoons in the Choir office from 4:00-5:15. We guarantee some hard work and lots of fun! If you have any questions, please contact Marqua Brunette, Director of Choirs.

## **Music Tips and Reminders**

During Advent, the service music we have been singing will change. This means that all of those selections preceded by the letter "S" will be found in the front of your hymnals, in the "Service Music" section. We encourage you to open up your hymnals to these pages and refresh your memories until you are confident of them again. We change service music for Advent and Lent so be prepared. The music used as the doxology changes too. This also means that service music will change again at Christmas and for January. You will want to read your bulletins carefully. Please keep your eyes open for visitors at this time of the year and be willing to help them find where we are in our hymnals and The Book of Common Prayer. Don't forget about our large-print hymnals placed in the back of the church. You are welcome to use one. We ask that you return it following the service. They will come in very handy for aging family and friends who might be visiting during the holidays. I'm sure they would appreciate you offering the bigger print for them to participate in singing of all those beautiful carols on Christmas Eve! They are also ideal for assisting children learning to read and following along in the service. There are a couple of large-print prayer books in the back too. Let's put them to good use.
