Backpack Buddies

You are invited to join in this wonderful new ministry in conjunction with Holy Nativity School that will provide meals for needy children. Many children in local public schools receive their only meals of the day at school. This ministry will provide food for eligible children through the weekend. Our partner school has over 90 children who are Title I and eligible for free meals. Fifty-three families have already signed up to be a part of this program.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

Children will receive a backpack of non-perishable food each Friday afternoon. The backpacks are provided by he Church. They return the backpacks on Mondays. they are refilled and delivered again the next Friday. church members are taking care of the logistics.

HOW CAN I HELP?

1. Sponsor a Backpack-If you sponsor a backpack, you are asked to bring the following to church:

- * 2 breakfast items (breakfast bars, etc.)
- * 6 juice boxes, 2 lunch items (Vienna sausage, soup, beanie weanies, etc.)
- * 2 dinner items (ravioli, canned meat, Chef Boyardee, etc.)
- *4 snacks (Goldfish, crackers, etc.)
- 2. Bring an offering-Bring one of more of the above items to church each week.

3. Make an offering - Monetary donations are certainly accepted. It is estimated that a "backpack of food" costs approximately \$10 week.

Also, any high-schoolers needing service hours are welcome to participate in stuffing backpacks, which can be accomplished at a time convenient for you (and whoever is unlocking the door to the Food Bank) during the week.

The Rite One Choir has become a very dedicated group We will offer a special Lenten Taizé service on Wednesthat loves to rehearse, sing and improve. They will next be singing on March 4th and April 1st, Palm Sunday. New voices are welcome to join us. Weekly rehearsals are on Thursday from 5:30 - 6:30 PM and we generally sing once a month in church. What began as only three voices a couple of years ago is now a real choir! Praise God!

The Chancel Choir

March is all about Lent and April begins with Palm Sunday, Holy Week and Easter. The Chancel Choir continues to rehearse for all of these special times of worship. Not only are these individuals dedicated to their singing for Sunday services and Thursday rehearsals, they are also very compassionate and caring. Rehearsals are weekly on Thursdays from 6:30 – 8:30 PM and Sunday mornings from 9:30 – 10:15. All are invited to join our song.

As in previous years, The Chancel Choir will be singing for both services on Easter Sunday. The two services will each contain the same music so no one misses a thing. The sounds of trumpet and tympani will echo through the sanctuary as the 'alleluias' return to worship signaling the resurrection of Christ.

Choosing music is not about 'pretty' but about scripture and lessons and helping you 'feel' something. It is an extension of the message and feeling is part of that too. May all of our music of this season reach you on many levels, not just with your ears but with your hearts.

Lenten Taizé Service on March 28th

day evening, March 28th at 6:15 PM, following the Wednesday evening supper. Our Taizé service is comprised of music, silence and prayers only. We will be blessed to have flute, violin, cello, piano and a couple of voices to lead our singing.

The service of Taizé is patterned after those from the Taizé Community in Taizé, France, a Community made up of Anglicans, Catholics, Lutherans, Orthodox, Evangelicals and others dedicated to outreach to those seeking spiritual meaning. The goal of this form of worship is reconciliation, helping individuals develop a path of communication with God to have an inner peace and a sense of responsibility to take peace to individuals, the family, the community and the world. Taizé services are characterized by quiet and candlelight, the repetition of melodious chants, silence, intercessions and contemplative praver. Taizé worship is informal and fluid, inviting the worshipper to move with the Spirit, through communal singing and corporate prayer, into the grand silence of communion with God. The service is ecumenical in spirit and all are welcome. Come and experience Taizé with us – you will be grateful that you did.

Taizé Volunteers Needed

There is always work to be done in the placing and lighting of the candles, clearing them following the service, etc. For many who attend, the actual worship begins with the preparation. We are seeking members of our congregation that would be willing to assist with this preparation and removal of candles. 
