
Wednesday, December 4th 6:30 PM

Adult Christian Education: Father Tom

Adult Sunday School has been great, if you've been missing it, my condolences! We started our fall term with Genesis, the creation stories, Adam & Eve naked in the Garden with Nachash the serpent causing trouble between them and for them, not to mention all the buck-passing; Cain murdering Abel because he thought God liked him best; separating the blended J and E stories of the Great Flood, and people finally getting divine permission to eat meat.

Now as we go into November we are working on the Creeds of the church, the Nicene or Nicaea-Constantinopolitan Creed; the *Quinque vult* unpopularly known as the Athanasian Creed, or the Creed of Saint Athanasius who didn't actually write it; and the Baptismal Covenant commonly called the Apostles Creed. We say the Nicene Creed nearly every Sunday in our Eucharist liturgy, and it's full of ancient theological assertions: we can stand and blithely recite it and go on to the Prayers of the People, or we can get together in Sunday School and find out what the heck we're asked to stand and say we believe.

After the Creeds, what? It'll be up to the group.

Our midweek thrust at Adult Christian Education is Wednesday Noon. We begin with Eucharist in the sanctuary at 11:30, with the Altar rail open as an option for anyone who wants to come up and receive the Laying On of Hands with Prayer for Healing; then we go into Battin Hall for a delightful lunch and a Bible study while we lunch together. It's all good and it's all free, and the Bible study has been interesting, focusing on one of the readings in the lectionary for the upcoming Sunday. Need a daytime midweek pick-me-up? This is it! And if you can come at Prime Time too, it's 5:30 Wednesday evenings with Eucharist and supper!
