Choral Evensong

Wednesday Evening Povember 5th at 5:30 pm

Evensong is a service of Evening Prayer set to music. "Evensong ... is a very tiny fragment of something else: it is a fragment of the worship which is offered to God by Christian people every hour in every part of the world. When you come to Evensong, it will be as if you were dropping in on a conversation already in progress — a conversation between God and people which began long before you were born and will go on long after you are dead."

In Choral Evensong the choir sings on "behalf of" the congregation. The settings of the Canticles of Mary (Magnificat) and Simeon (Nunc Dimittis) are always sung by the choir alone. The Suffrages (prayers) and the Responses between the Officiant and People can also be sung between the Officiant and Choir on behalf of the people. This allows the congregation time to meditate and enter into deeper prayer through words and music.

The Choral Evensong will include a processional, responses, chanted psalm, readings, sung Magnificat and Nunc dimittis by the choir, Apostle's Creed, prayers, choral anthem, closing prayers and hymn. Evensong offers to us the opportunity to gather and spend time in prayer while listening and participating in music that is especially selected to bring us into deeper understanding of the mysteries of our faith. Our prayer is that you will find this so as you experience this at Holy Nativity.

*Lunch meetings will be open to all members of the Diocese. The process for making lunch reservations will be announced by the Transition Committee as the time gets closer. Lunches will be informal times to meet the nominees. There will be no formal programs at these events.

**There will be three "walkabout" sessions held as all nominees travel around the Diocese together. At each location *anyone*, not only the lay convention delegates and clergy who will vote at the election convention, can gather to hear from and question the nominees as part of the discernment and calling of a new bishop. Again, the process for reservations and the exact agenda for these events will be announced later.

We have two really happy programs at Holy Nativity, our Adult Sunday School Class and our Tuesday Morning Bible Seminar

In Adult Sunday School we have read and discussed Old Testament bible stories, and recently have been into a couple of Paul's letters, Philippians and 1st Thessalonians. From a modern bible study point of view. We meet between services, 9:15 to 10:15 in the library at the east end of the brick pathway. Our table seats about twenty, is usually almost full, and there is just room enough for you and whoever you bring as your guest! Bring your coffee and a cookie and join us!

Tuesday Morning Bible Seminar, we meet in my office, "Through the Garage" across the street at 1011 E. 3rd Street. Ten o'clock Tuesday mornings, but come early for coffee, tea, hot chocolate and a biscotti and to visit. We have done the Gospel according to Thomas. At the moment, having started with the writing called "Secret Mark," we are reading through and discussing Mark's gospel, chapter by chapter, fascinating stuff, the first and oldest gospel in our New Testament canon. We adjourn promptly at 11:15. The table is nearly always full, and there's always room for two more, so come and bring a friend.

Backpacks News!

The backpack ministry is off and running, now six weeks into our routine of delivering 100 bags of food a week to help most of the kids at St. Andrews School through what otherwise would be a lean weekend. This year we've done something different and built teams by week, so everyone has the chance to participate once a month. It's hard to believe we've been at this for three years now, and every year we fill a few more backpacks than the year before (the first list we received contained only 48 names, less than half our current load). A NOTE ABOUT STEWARDSHIP

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Stewardship time is upon us once again. This is the time of year to consider our annual pledges, and Sandy and I always approach this prayerfully. It is a time to reflect on the past and think of the many blessings God has bestowed on our lives. Stewardship, to me, means taking care of the things we're given, and making sure that those things are there for those who come after us. In the case of Holy Nativity, Sandy and I have always felt blessed that God led us to come here; I remember thinking on the first Sunday we came to worship back in 1986, that we had found our Church Home. That feeling has never left all these years later. The relationships we've formed through the years have sustained us both emotionally, but more importantly, spiritually. Given that, we've always made sure to make a pledge every year. Not out of obligation, but because we want to share our blessings with others. At first we didn't tithe, because we felt money was tight, but each year we increased it as much as possible, always aiming for that 10% goal. Over time, what we gave became second nature, and we found that in spite of our giving (or maybe because of it) we never lacked for anything. It seems like God takes care of His stewards.

We give to the Church because we feel it is the best way to give thanks to God for his many blessings in our lives. I am reminded of a scene in *Fiddler on the Roof* where Tevye, a poor dairyman, meets Perchik, a poor traveller, at the public gathering spot in the town of Anatevka. Tevye, gives Perchik a piece of cheese to eat, and Perchik doesn't want to accept the freely given gift. Tevye responds simply, "It's a blessing for me to give." I always try to approach giving

from that wonderful perspective. Giving to Holy Nativity helps make sure that we can keep adding all of the wonderful programs that Father Steve has instituted. Giving to the Church monetarily is only one facet of giving. We also give by serving our fellow parishioners by volunteering to the various ministries that are available to us. Each one of us has gifts and talents that can be put to use to enrich the worship experience of those who attend our services; not just regulars, but newcomers and visitors as well. Over the years, it has been my pleasure (and a blessing) to serve our parish as a Lay Chalice Bearer, a Choir member, and as a vestry member. This has been my third time to serve you as a vestry member, and this year as your Junior Warden. Holy Nativity is our home, and I want to help in any way I can to take care of it. No one person can do everything, and we all have something to offer. Whether it is leading worship as a lay member, or volunteering to bring cookies for coffee time on Sunday morning, we can all work together to create a Church that is Christ-centered, loving, and welcoming to all who enter our doors.
