
All are welcome for a Christmas Potluck Dinner served at 5:30 pm. Turkey will be provided so please bring a holiday side-dish to share.

The teams are gathered (but there is always room for more!), and every week the Food Bank is alive with activity as our church family makes this ministry come alive. The cost is \$250 to feed a family every weekend of the school year (miraculous in itself, when you consider it). On All Saints' Sunday, November 6th, the children will be a part of the procession into the 10:30 service as we present our Saints Streamers recognizing acknowledged saints and those who "mean, God helping, to be one too". Every year we discuss people who live their lives to please God with such goodness that we believe they could become saints as well. Then we draw pictures or write their names on ribbons to make our streamers. Ask the children about them. Their nominees for sainthood are sometimes quite surprising. Please bring/send your children to Kids' Kingdom at 10:15 so we can line up for the procession.

Beginning on the 6th also, 9:15 Sunday School will be held in the Chapel Room in the two-story building during the adult and youth confirmation classes. The Chapel Room is the room closest to the Mary Stewart Poole Library where Fr. Tom is teaching so it is convenient for parents in the class. We would love to have a great big Sunday School group, so even if you are not in confirmation class, please come and bring your children. You will certainly enjoy sitting in with Fr. Tom's class regardless of when or if you have already been confirmed, and of course, you are always welcome to stay with us.

Wonderful Wednesdays will become even better for our children on November 9th when we incorporate Godly Play into our evening programs. This month Liz Ward will complete the third training session and obtain certification. We are delighted that she can lead us in offering this authentic, Montessori-based, Christian curriculum for our children. Florencia Pereira has taken the courses with Liz but is taking a baby-break before her final session. We are so proud of them.

Please begin asking your children to consider what they would like to do in the Christmas Pageant this year. The sign-up board will be out in Battin Hall on the Sunday before Thanksgiving. A child may write his or her name for any part, however, when there are multiple names for a solo part (i.e. Mary, Joseph, Gabriel, male and female innkeepers, star, etc.), the names are placed in a basket for drawing to determine who gets the role. We want every child to love telling the Holy Nativity story through the pageant and to feel his/her and our church's special attachment to the Holy Nativity. 


