....From the Food Bank

Thank you, my Holy Nativity family, for giving me the most gratifying and wonderful morning I have had in a very long time.

I just spent a little over an hour in our food bank, helping two gentlemen from Catholic Charities load their pickup truck. Twice. When they came into the room, they asked "How much are we allowed to have?" When I told them to take all of it, they were quite literally stunned. They called it a godsend, a life-saver, a gift from heaven. They couldn't stop smiling and thanking me, and stopped to spontaneously hug me more than once. I swear I actually saw tears in their eyes. Their donation pantry was empty, and they will not have money to purchase more until the end of the month. The families don't stop coming, though. They told me about the single-person boxes they make up, and how they are different from the family boxes. They told me how appreciative moms are of dessert mixes, so they can give their kids something "homemade". They told me about packaging chili with no beans together with two cans of beans, to make it go farther. Dry milk goes with boxes of cereal, because fresh milk is a luxury. Their clients love tomato soup because it can be made into so many other things. They just went on and on, joyfully filling me in on all the terrific things they were going to be able to do with our donations. I have all of you to thank that I got to be there and share their joy. I also left with tears in my eyes, though, because of the picture they built of the people that come to them for help. Imagine your kids coming home from school this Friday and asking "What's for dinner?" You know that all you have behind that cabinet door is a few cans of corn and green beans. What do you wish you had to give them? And what about when they are hungry at breakfast tomorrow? and lunch? Imagine feeding your family for an entire weekend out of one box of non-perishable food. What would you want to find in it? What would you put in it if you had a choice? That is what we need to restock our shelves, so that is what you should bring with you to Church on Sunday.

Most of us are blessed with enough. We may not be rich, but we are comfortable. This gives us the opportunity to do so much for others, who truly need it. An additional blessing is the fact that we now have lots of space for more donations!

Well, I gave that food to Catholic Charities on Tuesday and wrote the article on Wednesday. Thursday morning, I opened Face Book, and there was a post from the Rescue Mission. It was a public request for the only thing we had not completely given away - canned vegetables. I called them and arranged to transport everything left in the food bank room to them later that morning. Once again, I found myself basking in the gratitude of people who were tickled (their word) to be given the opportunity to continue feeding honestly hungry people. Selfishly, I enjoyed looking into those smiling faces very much. This leaves us in a fabulous situation - every bit of the food you donated is now actually out there feeding somebody. The shelves are empty, so we have plenty of room to stock back up. Additionally, I have realized that it actually is a bit selfish of me to give it out by myself. Are there any of you who would like to see where it goes and meet the people who are so happy to get it? You are welcome to join us when we load a truck or make a delivery. Please talk to Mike Dickey or to me, and I will give you a call the next time we distribute our abundance. It's nice to have enough, and it's even nicer to be able to share.

Parents, we would love to have your children join us, and you would love attending Fr. Tom's Sunday School for adults during the same time in the Mary Stewart Poole Library right next door to us.

During the 10:30 worship service, Fr. Steve dismisses the children three years old through fifth graders for Children's Church. ("Who is going to carry the cross this morning?") Continuing our New Testament theme, Judy Bennett has expanded our study of the miracles of Jesus with lessons that include crafts to help us remember each story. On the $23^{\rm rd}$, we will examine "Who are the Saints of God?" as we make our saints streamers that will be part of the All Saints' service the next Sunday.

We are grateful to all of you who work to make children's ministry meaningful and memorable for our children at Holy Nativity. Please join me in thanking those whose names are included in our schedules each month. We also thank our middle school and high school youth who are always willing to help...and we thank Ms. Marqua for finding great music for us to sing. We are really looking forward to singing "All God's Critters Got a Place in the Choir" at the Blessing of the Animals service. Everyone is invited to meet the pets and hear us sing.

WHAT'S A CHRISMON?

Chrismons are a type of Christmas Tree decoration used in many churches and often in the homes of Christians. The symbols used represent a variety of biblical and theological concepts that are well known among most believers. Often, if the ornaments on a Christmas tree are comprised mostly of women of the church

Christian symbols, the tree is known as a "Chrismon Tree." Chrismons are white with gold decorations of beads, ribbon, glitter, etc. It is common, however, to see these ancient Christian designs in other colors than white and gold. These would not be Chrismons, however, but simply Christian symbols -- and there's nothing wrong with that!
