## From Fr. Tom: Adult Christian Education

By the time you read this, Sunday school will have been in Fall Session for several weeks. We started out with a survey and discussion of The Letter of James, which the Lectionary had us reading for five Sundays. Now we have turned to the Gospel according to Mark, discovering Mark's agenda, his peculiarities, and his perfection. After Mark, before going on to more Scripture, we may pause to discover what General Convention gave us. There's a liturgy for blessing same sex commitments, which is authorized for trial use starting in Advent 2012. And there's a new liturgy for celebrating the life of pets who have died. We'll be reading and discussing those.

In weekday Bible Seminars we have a session in town on Tuesday mornings, gather in my HNES office *Through the Garage* before ten o'clock, then class from 10:05 to 11:15. We have a second, basically identical session at the beach on Wednesday afternoons, gather at St. Thomas by the Sea Episcopal Church, Laguna Beach before one o'clock, then class from 1:05 to 2:15. At the moment we are working our way through the Gospel according to Mark. We may take on Hebrews after that, depending on what the folks in the groups would like to do. #### **The Chancel Choir**

Fall is arriving and weekly choir rehearsals are beginning to think of the seasons ahead of us. October means we will begin rehearsing for Advent and Christmas Eve services, as well as Lessons and Carols. If you come and join the choir now you are certain to get in the Christmas spirit early! New members are always welcomed and it is a great opportunity to 'try' choir and see how well it works in your life and your service to your Church. Regular Thursday Chancel Choir rehearsals begin at 6:30 and Sunday mornings we rehearse again at 9:30. Every rehearsal includes music, fun, fellow-ship, laughter and a time for prayer. 
