

Adult Christian Education: Father Tom

Dear friends,

As we concluded our Bible Seminars last Spring 2013, I felt very much called to change the nature of my ministries as a retired priest -- to draw down after having expanded over the last four years, and to "begin again" so to speak. I was not sure what I needed to do, and so devoted last summer entirely to contemplating this, in meditation and prayer as well as the three silent directed retreats that consumed June, July and August. What I came to has been announced in various ways during September, but I want here to make sure that everyone who participated in our Tuesday morning and Wednesday afternoon Bible seminars knows, in case anyone would like to pick back up with me.

My passion or special enjoyment in retirement seems to be Bible study with other people, and I'm continuing that but in a new midweek format. I had intended to begin on September 4, the Wednesday after Labor Day, but my program is part of our parish program for Wednesdays, which the rector wanted to start on September 11. For scheduling reasons, that slipped to September 18, then to September 25, which is this week. Here's what I'm offering.

Wednesday 11:30 a.m. (actually, I will be in the church by 11:15)

Healing Eucharist in the church, Holy Nativity. The service will last 15 to 20 minutes, followed by adjourning to Battin Hall, our fellowship hall, for Bible Study with Light Lunch. Lunch will be provided, no charge, no reservation, just come.

Linda is helping me, taking charge of lunch arrangements. We shall see how it goes, how many come, how many to expect.

At first, and until we see what people want for the Bible Study, we will focus on the lectionary readings for each upcoming Sunday, starting with reading the Luke lesson as our Gospel in the Healing Eucharist, and bringing that Gospel into our Lunch Bible Study; but also looking at the OT, psalm, and NT/epistle readings.

Linda thinks I'm nuts, but I have in mind sixty minutes, adjourning at 12:30. If after the first Wednesday or two folks want to make that 12:45, I'm fine with that, but we'll want the starting and ending times to settle out precise and reliable so people can count on it.

This new weekly schedule simplifies my weekday schedule to Wednesdays only. I invite and welcome everyone!

The rest of my schedule is also on Wednesday, 5:30 p.m. at the church, an informal Eucharist, which I will share with the rector. Short Eucharist with music, followed by supper in Battin Hall, then sometimes just fellowship, sometimes a program. This is all coordinated with EfM's schedule and the Youth Group schedule and the choirs' schedules. Everyone is invited and welcome to Wednesday evening also, though most of the folks who had been coming to my mid-day Bible Seminars the past few years were not into coming out at night, so I wanted to be sure and offer the mid-day program described above.

I'm not asking for RSVPs. Still, if anyone wants to email me that you intend to come for the 11:30 Eucharist and Bible Study with Light Lunch, that notice could help Linda know how many to expect for lunch.

Again, all are invited and welcome. And God bless you, dear ones!
