But my +Time blog filling in for Adult Christian Education for The Duration. Wednesday mornings I'm writing and posting some sort of Bible study or other. It's no substitute for the fun we have in our Sunday School class, but there it is, and it anyone is inclined to respond, I post it on my Facebook page as well, where there is space for comments and maybe get discussion going if it comes to that.

The other days, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday I still go my own way, but trying to keep it decent for linked on the parish web site, and leaning toward something from the lectionary readings for each upcoming Sunday.

No way to diminish the seriousness of Covid-19, though for my part I'm trying to approach this as fun, and actually making it so for myself; and I hope for some of you.

Dear Class of 2020: Graduating High School/College Senior and others,

I hate the reason I am writing you. Graduation is supposed to be one of the most joyful and meaningful rites of passage in life. And yet, this global pandemic has robbed you of the fullness of this experience.

This hit home for me recently during a Zoom meeting. Suddenly, a young adult I know dashed across the background of her mother's computer screen. She is graduating from high school. My mind raced and my heart filled with all she is missing: proms, college trips, ceremonies, parties. Again, the reality of this global disaster flooded over me.

However, I will not let this tragedy have the final word! I believe in God, and while I may not have been literally present, I made a promise to you at your baptism and confirmation—"to support you in your life with Christ." Thus, I am writing to you for two reasons.

First of all, with this note comes my prayer for you. Amid all that is being lost, I pray you will remember what is most important, and what is most important is you. Your life matters, and nothing in this world can snatch the eternal and absolute value of who you are and who you will be in the future. So do not lose heart, and when you do lose heart, know that I will believe for you. And I ask that you believe for me, too. This is what faith does; we find strength in each other.

This faith brings me to the second reason for this note. We want to celebrate your accomplishment. I know that any attempt to do so will fall short of what you had hoped for in the next month. Still, your life matters, and because of the promise of support we made for you, we are compelled to try.

So here is what we want to do. We want to celebrate the class of 2020, specifically all those in the Episcopal Diocese of the Central Gulf Coast who are graduating from high school, college, post-secondary educational institution, or basic military training. To do so, we ask you to send us via email two photos: 1] a "formal" picture of you; and 2] an "informal" pic that depicts who you are. Have some fun with the second one! With these photos send us: a] your name; b] the school/institution from which you are graduating; c] the name of your church; d] and a brief prayer request for you. Email this to Jennifer Johnson, Communications Missioner, at jenn@diocgc.org. Please do this by Monday, May 4, 2020.

We will distribute the finished "digital annual" to the entire diocese. It will be an important historical record of the class of 2020. Even more, it will be a visible sign **today** to the rest of us of our hope in the future that your life holds. We want to celebrate your life, please help us to do so.

Remember, God made you. God knows you by your name and loves you. And no matter where you go or what you go through, God will never lose you. Amen.

Backpack Buddies by Trey Hutt

With schools closed, the Backpack Buddies program is on a break. We tried every way we knew how to continue to serve our students during the lockdown, but it just wasn't possible. After quite a bit of back-and-forth with the school and with the district, we finally had to admit that there wasn't much we could do in the current situation. We have to sit tight until the fall, and this left us with just over a week's worth of food that had nowhere to go. (Quite a bit of what we have will stale date before the fall semester begins.) Of course, God brought us an opportunity. Gulf Coast State College began their own food pantry for students following Hurricane Michael, and it has been under strain with so many students being out of work. Seeing this intersection between education and direct food aid, this felt very much "on mission" for our ministry. We opted to donate our remaining stock there so that it could be distributed directly to families.

In the fall, this ministry will be under new leadership. While I will remain involved, Jeff and Jackie Rahn will be taking the reins. BPB veterans, they were central to this ministry when it began several years ago. I don't think that they will change very much, and the food pantry has been completely redone since Hurricane Michael, anyway. Hopefully, they will make improvements where they see opportunities, and we will continue to see strong support from our parish family. Certainly, the need will not go away. Thank you to everyone that has supported us and our efforts, whether through donations, volunteer time, or prayer. We'll be back in August!
