Please Join Us for a Blessing of the Backpacks Parade!

Sunday, August 16th • 11:15 a.m. Holy Nativity Episcopal Church The South parking lot will be reserved for the parade staging area. (the grassy lot)

While Covid restrictions might prevent us from celebrating this event as we've done in years past, they will not prevent us from celebrating, blessing and praying for our children, their parents, teachers and school staff as they begin a school year unlike any other.

So, on August 16th we will have a blessing of the backpacks parade. Prayers for each grade will take place in the staging area and after a brief (around the block) parade we'll have a closing prayer and send-off. Feel free to decorate your cars/golf carts/etc. Children will receive a gift bag and a backpack blessing tag but most importantly, will see an outward and visible sign that we are remembering them and praying for them and their teachers.

Please practice social distancing and wear a mask when that is not possible. The service and parade will be live streamed. Look for additional details as they become available or call the church office (747-4000) with questions.

Anyway, shortly before August 23rd, I'll email the class roster email list asking what you think, not asking you to commit but asking you to tell me what you think about the idea of resuming classes, and I'll let everyone know the results of that.

Basically, class members receive an email with link to my blogpost +Time that I use for communication, on Sunday, sometimes Monday, and Wednesday mornings. Not always, but generally on Sunday, Monday and Wednesday I have some sort of Bible study or commentary or other lesson to share. There's no requirement for anyone to respond to those emails, although a few do and it's appreciated!
