Children's Ministry November and December 2020

As we approach Thanksgiving and Christmas, we are realizing how different our celebrations will have to be this year. However, we are determined to follow our M&M's to make Children's Ministry events "meaningful and memorable". Of course, we are being extremely careful to adhere to CDC guidelines and common sense to keep our children, and all of us, safe and healthy. With my own "underlying condition" of being old, I am having to call upon church staff and volunteers more than ever to make certain that our children have the best that we can give them in keeping our long-held traditions. I cannot thank you enough for your willingness to serve. I am so grateful for this church which cares so much for children.

On December 6th, Nicholas, Bishop of Myra (also called St. Nicholas...and known to some as Rich Doran) will be coming to the 10:30 worship service for the Children's Sermon and will be available for photos following the service. The following Sunday will still be Pajama Sunday when we can wear pajamas to church and bring pajamas (or bedtime books or stuffed animals) for children who really need them. Rather than process in a line into church, the children will sit with their parents. During the Children's Sermon, Fr. Steve will invite them to bring their gifts up to be placed before the altar. I am depending on someone with a big SUV to let me know that that they can load everything into their car for delivery the next day to Susan Bravo at Family Services downtown.

NOW, to the Christmas Pageant on Christmas Eve. After much consideration, we believe our best option is to move the 4:30 service to the Holy Pavilion at Holy Nativity Episcopal School. We will try to keep the service as much as possible like the traditional one except for the location... and the fact that even the angels and the sheep and goats will be wearing masks. We will stick with the original script as written by Matthew, Mark, and Luke. We are working on the details and asking volunteers to sign up for specific duties such as transportation or maybe just help for a practice, or decorating, setting the stage for worship and for the pageant part of the service, costuming, etc., etc., etc.. The signup will go out soon on Signup Genius.

There will also be online signup for the pageant participants. If several children sign for the same part, they should also make a second choice marked with a 2. Names will be drawn on Pajama Sunday.

Although we will not have as many songs this year, I hope that you will pay particular attention to the words of "You Be an Angel". Even mask-muted, listen for:

"The world is needy, much is wrong.

But even more is right in Bethlehem tonight."

I sing it year-round and it gives me comfort. I believe that we will make this a meaningful Christmas for the children; and I am absolutely certain that it will be memorable. They will someday be showing their grandchildren pictures of the masked St. Nicholas and their masked and socially distanced Christmas Pageant in 2020.

Lord, please strengthen our faith, hope, and love for one another.

Hello, folks, and happy holiday season! Thanksgiving is upon us, and behind that day of scrumptious delights that for me will include oyster dressing, comes Christmas, then New Years, and Epiphany. Wishing everyone a joyful season, with heart and mind especially on those for whom this year's Time of Celebration season brings grief, sadness, new loneliness without someone dear, beloved and special. May the Lord's presence bless you most of all, and even more so if this is your first time without someone, that empty chair.

For us in adult Sunday school, things are not "back to normal" and I don't expect us ever to go back, because that's not the way Time and Creation work. We keep moving. Still, we are settling in to something like good old feelings. Our Sunday school class has resumed meeting in the Library, where we are spread out and comfortable, masks coming and going, coffee and an individually wrapped nibble of some sort. Precautions include handouts that have not been handled before. Everyone is invited and welcome, 9:15 to 10:15 Sunday mornings, the Library is at the end of the yellowing brick road, the single story building with wide glass doors, just beyond Smith Pavilion. Come early, come on time, come late, come if you want to and are comfortable doing so. Otherwise, we are trying to succeed in live streaming the class on Holy Nativity Episcopal Church Facebook page. We don't have the Sound down pat, but maybe we can move the camera closer, and maybe I can talk even louder.

Starting Sunday, November 29, 2020 the church

moves into a new ecclesiastical year, Year B, in which our main focus will be on the Gospel according to Mark, a fun book to read, mark, learn, discuss and enjoy together. Though years later than the letters of Paul, the gospel of Mark seems to be the first and oldest of the four canonical gospels, written about 70 Anno Domini Common Era, and with it's own specific evangelical agenda, come enjoy with us if you are so inclined.

As well as Mark, we'll be reading and enjoying Old Testament stories and various epistles. And at first in the new church year we'll be talking about Advent itself.

I would say "I can't wait", but there's plenty of Time, and the wait itself is full of anticipation and adventures as we wrap up Year A and venture into Year B.

We have a Sunday school email list of folks who've said they want to receive the one or two Sunday school class emails that go out each week to class members and anyone else who's interested. Greetings from Rev. Steven

Most of you have noticed that I (as well as every clergy person I know) are increasingly targets of email/text hacking and cloning. Most of these communications are clones, phishing, whaling, and smishing attacks by using impersonation tactics to take advantage of unsuspecting people which means we are not hacked but rather an email address is created similar to my own and sent to church members requesting assistance. Typically, the email says "I need a favor." If you respond, you'll be asked to do things like purchase gift cards. Do not click on any links or reply to the message if you have any suspicion the email is fraudulent.

This is incredibly frustrating for everyone and even more so when a parishioner or friend falls victim to the scam. Emails from Holy Nativity clergy will always include @holy-nativity.org. If you receive a suspicious email claiming to be from me or Father Tom or any other church staff and would like to report it, please send the email to info@holy-nativity.org or use one of the methods below.

What you can do about fraudulent emails:

- If you know the email to be fraudulent, label it as spam.
- Visit <u>www.us-cert.gov/report-phishing</u>, the United States Computer Emergency Readiness Team, or forward all emails to the <u>Anti Phishing Work Group</u> at <u>reportphishing@apwg.org</u>.
- Report text scams: <u>Federal Trade Commission's Complaint Assistant</u>.
