Adult Christian Education, Father Tom

Dear friends, good morning/afternoon, and shalom!

After a year we are still in various levels of lockdown and restrained social involvement due to covid, including at church and Sunday School - - and I don't know about you, but speaking for my-self, vaccinated, healthy and reasonably alert, I'm trying take the optimist view, and am indeed experiencing, that we humans are innovative to accommodate circumstances, and we seem to be bringing some good out of even this.

More than ever, Linda and I appreciate living into retirement together and at home overlooking St Andrews Bay to our south, east and west, a lovely park and downtown St Andrews to the north. We somewhat miss dining out, but not really, and I've found a source for fried oysters - - call first then go down to Hunt's Oyster Bar and pick up my order - - Hunt's are so close I can see them from my office here!

Church attendance, and Sunday School attendance, are lean, much sparser than "before", but like the rest of Life, this is now not then, and as the bill on my orange cap proclaims, Life Is Good. Both are streamed online for anyone who wants to attend from a distance, and I've learned to ignore the camera and not let it bother me, more certain than ever that I'm not called to televangelism. Worship, church services, are somewhat abbreviated and I've grown to prefer it this way. It takes longer to prepare a shorter sermon, but that's good. There's less ceremony, and I'm appreciating that. John's prelude music beautifully takes the place of our "before" prelude and processional hymn combo, I'm good with keeping it that way opening and closing, having just the sequence for our one sung hymn. Though instead of sitting I'd prefer to stand for the sequence as that's when, theologically, we honor Christ coming into the midst of us, the Word present in and as the Gospel. You can read the Nicene Creed as well as we can all stand and recite it, and I'm always good with that.

Anymore, the eucharistic feast is Bread only now, and line up to come up front for it instead of kneeling at the Altar rail: that's longstanding practice in Roman Catholicism, and I'm all for it as a new Tradition even though forced upon us. Speaking for myself alone, I cannot see the common chalice ever returning, and for all the reasons that the chalice is suspended now, I'd favor keeping it this way; here at Holy Nativity most people had gotten around to receiving only the Bread anyway.

So what else to say? Adult Sunday School class goes on, 9:15 to 10:15, between services, in the parish library. Come early, come on time, come late, all are welcome. Class sessions are no longer as wonderfully noisy as pre-covid, but we are keeping on keeping on, including through the Spring and Summer into Fall - - I do not like sitting out the time between services, so we'll continue without taking the summer break that some other parish events do. Mostly Bible study, mostly the readings appointed by the Lectionary for the Sunday; although I'm thinking that during the summer we may digress into some of the Bible books we're less familiar with - - an Apocrypha book or two, maybe one of those short OT prophecies like Obadiah, maybe a Titus, Timothy, or John epistle. Maybe a non-canonical gospel or epistle from Early Christian Writings. Stay tuned, things are getting better and better!

As the CDC and our Diocese of the Central Gulf Coast relax some Covid restrictions, we will follow suit. We will return to having our volunteers in the nursery and have volunteer teachers helping with Children's Church and Wonderful Wednesday Evenings.
