

Our new assembly location, in Battin Hall, is working reasonably well for us. The lighting has been addressed and is improved, but the especially good thing is its convenience for everyone, in all weather, and immediate, adjacent to where folks are going and coming for worship services. It's a good thing, and appreciated!

We have an Advent adventure most Decembers, and I'm intending the same for the two December Sundays that I'll be leading the class, December 5 and December 12 (December 19 and December 26 are my preaching Sundays, when Dr Dan Finley leads the class, for which I am deeply grateful). For my Sundays I'm intending to present for discussion the Advent-related Christian doctrines of Virgin Birth and Second Coming. On the Second Coming session we may contemplate some out-of-the box imaginings including William Butler Yeats' startling poem "The Second Coming" - - if your imagination is as valid as mine, and Yeats', and Revelation John's, and Paul's, what will it be like, this Second Coming that we acclaim so confidently,

Christ has died Christ is risen Christ WILL come again.

Paul believed the Second Coming was imminent. Did Jesus also believe that; as gospel writers quote him, there is scriptural evidence that he did. This anticipated Second Coming has been imminent for over two thousand years now, what do you think? In last Sunday's gospel, Luke quotes Jesus saying that there will be signs. Every generation of Christians think they see signs, do you see signs? Come to class.

Children's Ministry December 2021 By Beverly McDaniel

Now in Advent and looking toward Christmas, many of us will greet the holidays with mixed emotions: a sadness as we miss those we have lost, yet a happiness in the sweet traditions of the season. Being around the children brings joy just by seeing their excitement and delight. Every year I ask you to pay attention to the words of one of our pageant songs, "You Be an Angel".

"The world is needy, much is wrong. But even more is right in Bethlehem tonight."

Let us keep remembering that message and help our children gain that understanding and reassurance.

On December 5th, Nicholas, Bishop of Myra (also called St. Nicholas...and known to some as Rich Doran) will be coming to the 10:30 worship service. Please plan to arrive a little early for church and have the children come to the Godly Play Room in Kids' Kingdom to get ready to process into the church. They will stay up front and sit on the communion kneelers until Fr. Steve gathers them in for the Children's Sermon. When they leave, following the cross, they will go to the pavilion to decorate their Christmas cookies. After the service, St. Nicholas will be available for photos. Do not miss doing this. These make great "Kodak Moments" whether framed or on Facebook. After pictures, come with your children to the pavilion to pick up their decorated Christmas cookies.

The following Sunday, 12/12, is Pajama Sunday when we can wear pajamas to church and bring pajamas bring (or bedtime books or stuffed animals) for children who really need them. Please come by 10:10 so the children can gather in the Godly Play Room and go over the procedures to be a part of the Processional again. And this time they can walk up to the altar to place their gifts there, then sit on the floor or kneelers for the Children's Sermon. After church, will some of you please volunteer to help load the pajamas and other gifts so that they can be delivered the next day to Susan Bravo at Family Services downtown.

In Children's Ministry, we want our children to have lessons and experiences that are both meaningful and memorable. Last year's Christmas Pageant on a windy, rainy, and cold Christmas Eve certainly fit with memorable, and being back together, inside our dear church, this year is much more meaningful (and appreciated) now. Although new performers may be ageing in or aging out, we will stick with the original script as written by Matthew and Luke.

Of course, we need volunteers to sign up for specific duties such as Costume Chair and costumers, set designers, etc., or help with cues and prompts. The signup will go out soon on Signup Genie. There will also be online signup for the pageant participants. If several children sign for the same part, they should also make a second choice marked with a 2. Names will be drawn on Pajama Sunday. Please note that the key roles that require being at practice are marked with stars. Costume fittings will be on Sundays after church and as scheduled online with costumers.
