### September Newsletter - - Fr Tom

Still and always a team member! In April 2009, Father Steve phoned me at my office at St Thomas by the Sea, Laguna Beach, where I was finishing up and retiring from five years as their parish priest, and he invited me to return to Holy Nativity as Priest Associate, to share in the ordained ministry here, and to have oversight of adult Christian education programs - - the adult Sunday school class, Education for Ministry, and for some years I offered a mid-week Bible study class. That began thirteen and a half years ago, and I have thoroughly enjoyed serving our congregation here and working with Father Steve.

Not going anywhere now, though I am easing off, scaling back as I come up on my eighty-seventh birthday. The end of May, Dr Dan Finley, who is on faculty at Gulf Coast State College, took over mentoring the adult Sunday school class, which is enormously appreciated. As long as I am able, as long as I can be a competent helper to the rector, I will stay on the preaching schedule however Fr Steve and I agree, and I will continue to fill in as Supply Priest when the rector is away.

One change folks will notice is that I may be here less, when I am not scheduled to preach or supply, as Linda and I plan other things of a retirement nature for our Time. Recently, for example, we had a trip to Apalachicola that involved Sundays. Coming up soon, Hurricane Season permitting, we plan a short drive to Waukula Springs, to stay most of a week at the old Lodge. Waukula Springs is near enough to Tallahassee that we hope to make it also a visit with family there. Some Sunday mornings we may do what folks have been doing off and on since the pandemic started, have a leisurely Sunday breakfast and be present at the Holy Nativity 10:30 service streamed online; when we're doing that, I'll "sign in". Most Sunday mornings we expect to be here for 10:30, and when that happens I'll assist the celebrant at the Altar. Or sometimes I may sit in the congregation with Linda.

Holy Nativity has been an important part of our lives since the summer of 1955, when Linda and I arrived home from our colleges to find that our parents had moved our membership and we were part of the founding families here, coming from St Andrew's Episcopal Church, which my grandfather had helped found in the early 1900s, and where we had grown up. I remember asking my mother as we drove up 3rd Street to Bonita Avenue and parked alongside a new concrete block building on a dirt road in the scrub oaks of The Cove, "What's the name of the new church?", and she said, "It'll be either Nativity or Holy Nativity, we haven't decided yet." Our hearts have been here ever since, and we are committed for life! We're not going anywhere, but we are at a place where it's Time for me to ease off a bit, and with the rector's concurrence, that's what I'm doing!



Since the beginning of this year, the Laundry Love Ministry - lovingly being staffed monthly by volunteers from both Holy Nativity and St. Andrew's Episcopal Churches - has been blessed in being able to serve 146 families and assist 325 individuals to have clean clothes. Also, we are just beginning to track the number of loads washed, and to date we are just over 200 loads total!

On average, we are spending around \$400 on each event and inflation has raised its head, so increased costs are on the horizon. Laundry Love asks for your continued prayers and financial support. Any monetary donation will make a huge difference in the life of someone in our community.
