

Children's Ministry May 2023 By Beverly McDaniel

Easter 2023 was a glorious day at Holy Nativity Episcopal Church, and this is my gratitude newsletter. Thank you, Lord, for the beautiful Easter weather. The brunch was lovely, and we are grateful to all who brought delicious dishes, and to you who helped with set-up and clean up and table decorations, and decorating the church, to those of you who donated candy and eggs, and to the Youth Group who helped stuff eggs, hide eggs, and direct the hunt.

To celebrate this essential part of our faith and its accompanying traditions requires dedication and effort, so all of us appreciate and benefit from the work of our volunteers. Sharing in these special whole church occasions draws us together, strengthening our sense of Christian community and offering our children the security and comfort of their church family.

Do you notice (more often than not) the kindness and consideration shown by our "big kids" for the younger ones, and how the younger children admire and follow the examples set by the older ones? (We rarely fail to point out this important responsibility.) We appreciate the wonderful families that we are blessed to work with as we come to know and love your children and grandchildren. We are so glad that you want them to be here.

We can all be thankful for the intangible rewards and blessings that our children receive by taking part in religious festivals and church activities. The events are not just for parties and playtime. Worshipping together and sharing traditional occasions make long-lasting memories for our children. Will we ever forget the streamers that flew like exclamation marks after the children's outstanding Easter song that concluded that joyful Easter service this year?

To add meaning to the memories, our Godly Play lessons and Bible stories in Children's Church and on Wednesday Evenings during Lent have focused on the crucifixion and resurrection...what happened and why it is so important to us now. Quiz your children to know their levels of understanding. Their perceptions and their questions are always interesting, sometimes funny, and sometimes quite thought provoking.

May is usually a happy time for the children at the church. May 14th is Mother's Day and Miss Leigh has chosen a beautiful song for the children to sing. She will be teaching it to them during Children's Church and we can practice a little on Wednesday Evenings. Please encourage your children to take part in singing for you. They delight all of us. This is also the day that we thank our acolytes and congratulate our high school graduates. The children will be taking part in the service, acting as greeters, readers, and ushers.

The following Sunday holds special significance for our older children. We teach them that confirmation is the public affirmation of their own decision to accept Jesus and follow his teachings. We as Christians must do all in our power to support each other in a life with Christ, and we too can promise, "We will".

For some of us, we are almost as proud and happy at confirmations as the families, and at a church like Holy Nativity, we often feel like family. We promised, "We will", at their baptisms, praised their performances (Mother's Day?), complimented their Easter outfits, admired so many homemade birthday cards and a folded airplane get-well-soon card, Auburn orange and blue wooden beads, plastic beads, braided bracelets, Cherished Angel earrings, cheered their victories and cried over losses (especially pets and occasionally boyfriends). How grateful can we be? So much love! So much fun! And to be rewarded by believing that we are serving God and following his will. We are nurturing children to "Love God and love one another".
