



Books for the Incarcerated Mission

If you would like to join the Books for the Incarcerated, a new Holy Nativity mission outreach, please know it is simple, requiring you to buy a book or two, as often as you'd like, and be part of a small mission that could have a big impact on people's lives. Due to drug dealers now able to smuggle drugs into the spines and pages of books, our jails and prisons have thrown away all their books, and there is no money in their budgets to replace them. We have worked on replac-



ing their books but so far they will only allow brand-new paperbacks only, and mailed from an approved source (Amazon, Religious book stores, etc....). Amazon has great paperbacks for \$4.00 and they mail for free. We believe many of the incarcerated are desperate to keep their minds occupied and be offered something we all take for granted, expanding our minds and souls. Books must have no hard covers, metal binders, porn, nude pictures, graphic details, racism, suicides, child sex or pedophilia. Since we cannot mail them ourselves (we're working on changing that), they must be mailed to jails by the vendor.

Spring 2024 Confirmation Class. Our diocesan bishop will be here Sunday, May 12, 2024 for his annual visit, including Confirmation, our rite of welcoming folks who want to be Christians in the Episcopal Church. Our prayerbook (page 860) says "Confirmation is the rite in which we express a mature commitment to Christ, and receive strength from the Holy Spirit through prayer and the laying on of hands by a bishop" and goes on to say "It is required of those to be confirmed that they have been baptized, are sufficiently instructed in the Christian Faith, are penitent for their sins, and are ready to affirm their confession of Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord."

We offer two one-hour Sunday morning classes - - which we call "Episcopal 101" - - for those who may wish to be confirmed that day. The classes will be **Sunday morning**, **April 14** and **Sunday morning**, **April 21**, between Sunday morning services, 9:15 to 10:15. I will be conducting the classes. If you want to be confirmed, or are thinking about being confirmed, or just would enjoy learning more about being a Christian in the Episcopal Church, you are invited. <u>You will need to sign up ahead of time by emailing admin@holy-nativity.org</u>

You won't want to miss this incredible opportunity to gather in God's front yard at beautiful Camp Beckwith. Lots of great fun, fellowship, and relaxation. Just ask anyone who attended last year's retreat. Look for the display in the lobby for information and sign-up.





Holy Nativity participates in several community outreach programs that we all hear about, make donations to, and get involved in throughout the year. However, there is one that you may not be familiar with today, even though it touches many people in our area. This particular ministry is St. Andrew's Community Suppers, or SACS. SACS is a continuation of Suppers at Grace, a program that we became involved in nearly 15 years ago. That ministry was suspended in the Summer of 2021 as a result of lack of participants due to COVID and lost leadership at Grace Episcopal Church. A group of St. Andrews Episcopal Church parishioners felt the need to reconvene in the Fall of 2022, but with plans to move it to their location. I was contacted and jumped at the opportunity to serve again, as were several of our previous "Grace workers".

Suppers are provided by different church affiliates each Thursday evening from 6-7:00 in the St Andrews' parish hall, which is adjacent to a wonderful commercial kitchen where the meals are prepared. The dinners are served from a buffet line, and then the guests sit at nicely set tables, offering nutrition and dignity to each. Along with the hot dinners served in house, the guests are also given togo meals, sack lunches, and water. On many occasions we offer free clothing, hygiene packs, shoes, and such.

Holy Nativity serves to members of our food insecure community on the second Thursday of each month. Typically our team of 12 serves about 75 people, 100 plates, because many come back for seconds and thirds,80 -100 to-go dinners, and 48 sack lunches... you do the math!!! Big Mama's on the Bayou, Dan-D-Donuts, Pier Park Panera Bread, and Back Beach Publix donate their leftovers to our mission, but the majority of the funding comes from the HNEC outreach program reserve. On average it takes \$375 each month to provide wholesome, healthy meals for our guests. In addition, we also pay \$45 to St Andrews to cover supplies. This all adds up, and my hopes are to build a fund to offset the expenses of this very needed and heartwarming ministry. This is where you come in! Please prayerfully consider adding this mission to your one time, monthly, or annual pledge, specifying "SACS" on the memo line of your check or online donation. Every little bit will help and will be greatly appreciated.

We will continue with these lessons through Easter.

We can still use additional volunteers to help with coverage while Taylor is out on maternity leave and we will definitely need some extra volunteers for Easter Sunday as well. Thank you to all our current Nursery volunteers for your willingness to serve in this special ministry. The Nursery will be open for the Wednesday, March 27 Stations of the Cross service at 6pm. If you will need Nursery for your child so you can attend the Maundy Thursday evening service or Good Friday afternoon service please text or call Liz Ward at (864) 420-5855 in advance.

Mrs. Gladden has been practicing with the children to sing on Palm Sunday, as well as working on another special piece with them at Children's Choir every other week during Children's Church time. All children PreK through Teens are invited to join us each Sunday as we pray, learn, and sing together.

In March we will continue our Lenten learning about Jesus' life and ministry as we explore the season of Lent and prepare our hearts for the celebration of Easter. We will hold our annual church Easter Egg Hunt between services on Easter Sunday, come early so you don't miss it! In order to have a fun-filled egg hunt we need your help. We kindly ask all of our church members who would like to help us make sure every child at our church has a basket filled with joy on Easter, to please donate plastic eggs and candy, or donate pre-filled eggs. These can be dropped off in the Kids Kingdom area on Sundays/Wednesdays. If you can't donate but would like to volunteer to help with the Easter Egg Hunt in other ways, please contact Liz Ward.
