
When the pantry is full, all donate items will delivered to the Family Service Agency of Panama City. *A timely shopping reminder from the Mary Martha Circle.*

Suppers are provided by different church affiliates each Thursday evening from 6-7:00 in the St Andrews' parish hall, which is adjacent to a wonderful commercial kitchen where the meals are prepared. The dinners are served from a buffet line, and then the guests sit at nicely set tables, offering nutrition and dignity to each. Along with the hot dinners served in house, the guests are also given to-go meals, sack lunches, and water. On many occasions we offer free clothing, hygiene packs, shoes, and such.

Holy Nativity serves members of our food insecure community on the second Thursday of each month. Typically our team of 12 serves about 75 people, 100 plates, because many come back for seconds and thirds,80 -100 to-go dinners, and 48 sack lunches...you do the math!!! Big Mama's on the Bayou, Dan-D-Donuts, Pier Park Panera Bread, and Back Beach Publix donate their leftovers to our mission, but the majority of the funding comes from the HNEC outreach program reserve. On average it takes \$375 each month to provide wholesome, healthy meals for our guests. In addition, we also pay \$45 to St Andrews to cover supplies. This all adds up, and my hopes are to build a fund to offset the expenses of this very needed and heartwarming minis-try. This is where you come in! ## Father Tom - the Bishop is coming, the Bishop is coming!

"Episcopal" is a New Testament Greek word that means overseer or "bishop" and we are called The Episcopal Church because the chief pastoral and administrative leadership in our church is through clergy ordained as bishops, who head geographical areas called "dioceses". Holy Nativity Episcopal Church is a parish of the Episcopal Diocese of



the Central Gulf Coast, with the bishop's headquarters office in Pensacola. It's the custom of the church for the bishop to come to each parish congregation each year for an annual pastoral visit, which includes time with the congregation, checking over official records including the attendance record book and the Parish Register of members and services, and meeting with clergy and vestry. The main event of this "Episcopal visit" is usually a worship service that includes the Rite of Confirmation. Here's what the Catechism says about that:

Q. What is Confirmation?

A. Confirmation is the rite in which we express a mature commitment to Christ, and receive strength from the Holy Spirit through prayer and the laying on of hands by a bishop.

Q. What is required of those to be confirmed?

A. It is required of those to be confirmed they they have been baptized, are sufficiently instructed in the Christian Faith, are penitent for their sins, and are ready to affirm their confession of Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord.

On our parish calendar for 2024, coming up this Spring on Sunday, May 12th, Holy Nativity will have our annual episcopal visit, with service of Confirmation for members who would like to be confirmed or received into the Episcopal Church by the bishop. Each year before the bishop comes, we have an "Inquirers' Class" or "Confirmation Class" (which we like to call Episcopal-101), to offer instruction in the Christian Faith, and about Holy Nativity and the Episcopal Church as our branch of the Body of Christ.

The class is offered by Father Tom during the hour between services, 9:15 to 10:15. This year we plan two one-hour sessions, Sunday April 14 and Sunday April 21. Please email the office and let us know. <u>admin@holy-nativity.org</u>).

Everyone is invited, by the way! Not only folks interested in being confirmed, but anyone who would like to know more, or enjoy a refresher course, about the Episcopal Church.

Jesus is Risen! Spring has arrived and everything is made new. March was a wonderful month preparing for Easter with the children! Thank you to everyone who donated eggs and volunteered to help with the Easter Egg Hunt. Special thanks to the Youth Group for their help with all the Easter fun! During our Wonderful Wednesday Lent lessons we explored the Godly Play story the Mystery of Easter, enjoyed some evening play and fellowship, and made an edible object lesson as we learned about Jesus' death and resurrection while making "Resurrection Rolls". The children enjoyed making these treats together and the recipe is shared on our Facebook page if you'd like to try making them at home. Thanks to Scott Clemmons for the suggestion! On Sundays, during Children's Church, we completed The Faces of Easter Godly Play series that teaches the story of Jesus' birth, life, work, death, and resurrection. It is always an interesting story to "wonder" with the children about. Their insights and perspectives show developing theological thinking in the youngest children and deepening thinking with the older children.

In Nursery news, our Nursery worker, Mrs. Taylor Hall continues to recover from the birth of her new baby girl. She experienced additional complications two weeks after the birth and had to undergo additional surgery. Please join me in praying for her as she recovers and hopes to join us back in the Nursery in mid to late April. Mrs. Gladden and the Children's Choir did a wonderful job on Palm Sunday and made us all feel joyful with their song at Easter! She will continue working on another special piece with them during Children's Choir, every other week during Children's Church time.
